

Dave Rogers

Dave Rogers graduated from Martinsburg High School in 1969. While attending Martinsburg, Dave lettered in football, basketball and baseball. He was named to the tri-state basketball team, played in the 1968 state basketball tournament when only 4 teams qualified, named All-CVAL and Tri-State league quarterback as a senior and was named Martinsburg High School Athlete in 1969.

After graduating from Martinsburg High School, he attended and played basketball at Shepherd College from 1969 to 1973. During his tenure at Shepherd, Dave was captain of the basketball team his junior and senior year, was a member of the 1000 point club, ranked in the top 15 in scoring, ranked in the top 10 in rebounding, received the 1973 outstanding physical education award, and was selected to the WVIAC All-Tournament team in 1972. Dave also holds the record for most rebounds in a game (28). And was inducted into the Shepherd Athletic Hall of Fame in 1990.

Upon completion of his degree at Shepherd College, Dave started teaching and coaching. Dave has served as a teacher, coach, Athletic Director, and Assistant Principal at Martinsburg High School. He currently serves as Principal of South Middle School and is the head coach of the boys' basketball team at Martinsburg High School. He has coached at MHS for 31 years and holds an impressive record of 566 wins and 166 losses and has consistently been competitive qualifying for the WV State Basketball Tournament 21 times with two State Championship teams in 1994 and 2009 and three State Runner-up teams. One of his proudest moments was having the honor of coaching his son, Brett, on the 2009 State Championship team. Because of his excellence in coaching, Dave has been bestowed with many honors over the years including many regional coach of the year awards, West Virginia Coach of the year in 1994, WVSSAC Basketball Coach of the Year and will be considered for National Coach of the Year by the National Federation Coaches Association.
