Doug Creek is a 1987 Martinsburg High School graduate. While at MHS, he was named to various all conference teams, was a member of AAA All-State Baseball team and was named Gatorade State Baseball Player of the Year.

After graduating from MHS, Doug attended Georgia Tech from 1987-1991. While at Georgia Tech, Doug set school records for career wins and strikeouts. He was inducted into the Georgia Tech Hall of Fame in 2001.

In 1987 and 1991, Doug was a member of Team USA. In 1987, he was a Silver Medalist in the Junior World Games and was named Most Outstanding Left Handed Pitcher of the games.

He was drafted in the 5th round by the California Angels in 1990 and drafted in the 7th round and signed to the St. Louis Cardinals in 1991. While playing in the minor leagues, he was a member of three All Star Teams (1993 Cardinals, 1997 Giants, 1999 Cubs) and two championship teams (1995 Cardinals, 2005 Tigers)

Doug's Major League debut was in 1995 with the Cardinals. Over the years, he played parts of 9 season with 7 different Major League Teams those being the Cardinals, Giants, Cubs, Devil Rays, Mariners, Blue Jays and Tigers. In 1998, he played in the Japanese Professional league with the Hanshin Tigers.

Doug has learned the art of pitching from some of the best, including Bob Gibson, Dick Pole, Rick Mahler, John Tudor, Chuck Hernandez, Gil Patterson , Bob Cluck, Larry Rothschild, Bill Fischer and Rick Kranitz.

Doug officially retired in 2006, ending a 15 year professional career. He is now a licensed captain, fishing guide and tournament fisherman.
