Ted Kershner was a member of the class of 1955. Teddy Kershner was the star of the first unbeaten, untied MHS football team in 1954. He led the team in scoring, rushing, and won a full scholarship to the University of Maryland. As a freshman, he played for Maryland in the Orange Bowl. Kershner was the hero of the 'nationally acclaimed' Queens game where the Queen of England attended the Maryland-North Carolina game at Byrd Stadium.

Kershner was also a great track athlete and was one of the best 40 and hurdler participants in the Bulldogs history.

After college, Mr. Kershner entered the banking and finance industry. He retired in 2001 and currently resides in North Carolina and says "now golf is my game."
